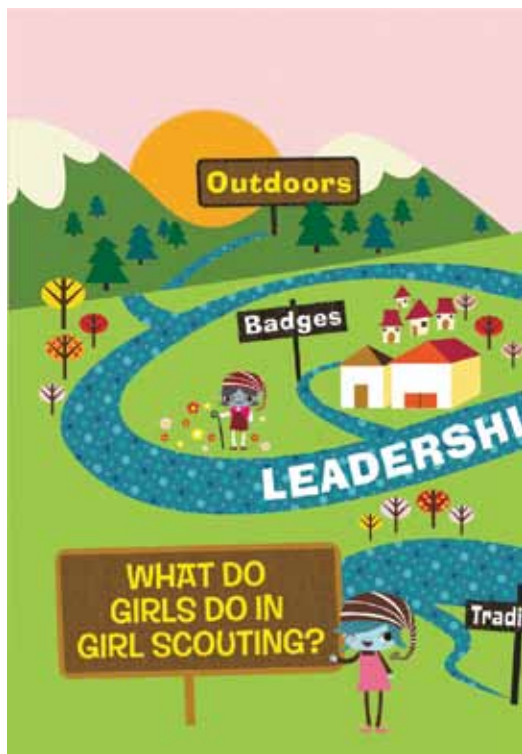


Why Should My Daughter Join Girl Scouts?

Girls develop best among other girls—away from school pressures, social cliques and boys. Your daughter’s leadership potential will blossom in **a safe, fun and social environment** where she can be herself and try out new things.

As a Girl Scout, she will benefit from **hands-on leadership experiences that encourage her to:**

- Take an active role in deciding and planning what she wants to do.
- Learn by doing in a supportive, girls-only environment where learning is cooperative, not competitive.
- Share special ceremonies and meaningful Girl Scout traditions with other girls.
- Earn badges, awards and national recognitions for new skills and accomplishments.
- Plan and carry out service projects that benefit her community and foster a lifelong commitment to make a difference in the world.

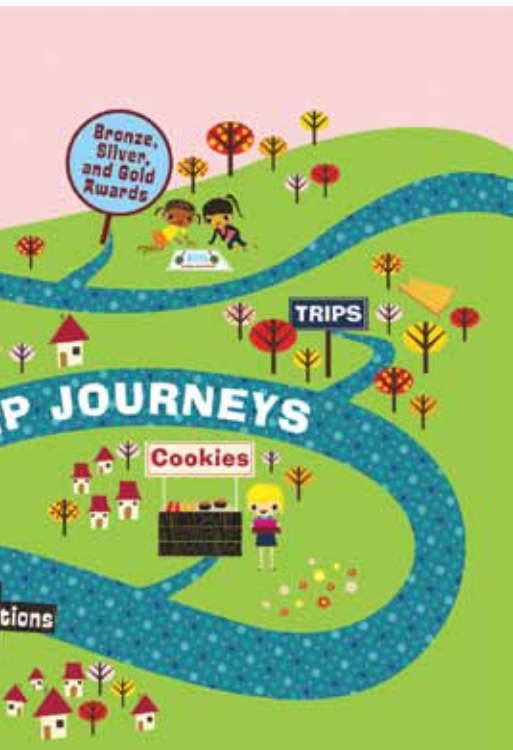

WE BRING OUT THE BEST IN GIRLS.

In Girl Scouts your daughter will have many opportunities to make **friends**, develop **leadership skills**, boost her **self-confidence** and strengthen her personal **values**.

Her experiences can be as individual and unique as she is. With so many **fun and flexible new ways to participate**, she can choose just one or choose them all!



Camp. She'll love learning about nature and the environment at a sleep-over camp or a local day camp.

Series and Events. Does she have a passion like art, horseback riding, fashion design? She can explore her talents and have fun with other girls who love the same things, at times that fit her schedule.

Travel. She can broaden her horizons by seeing and experiencing new places, people and things through Girl Scout travel opportunities.

Troop. She can meet with a group of girls regularly, share amazing experiences and learn how girls working together can make a difference.

WHO CAN BE A GIRL SCOUT?

There is only one qualification...you have to be a girl. That's it! Girl Scouts is open to **all girls, kindergarten through grade 12**, and you can join at any time.

Nearly **24,000 Orange County Girl Scouts**, from every walk of life and zip code, **are already building the leadership values, skills and abilities they need for success**, now and in the future. They're having a great time doing it, and your daughter will too!

GIRL SCOUTING IS FLEXIBLE AND AFFORDABLE.

Annual national **membership dues are only \$12 per year** (October - September).

Optional costs include uniforms (encouraged, but not required), books, badges/patches, and any fees for camps, series/events or travel opportunities that she chooses to participate in. Troop expenses vary, based on troop members' planned activities, projects and supplies.



Proceeds from the annual **Cookie and Fall Product sales can be used to help cover expenses.** Financial Assistance is available when required.

WHEN CAN SHE JOIN?

Your daughter can join at **any time, in any grade.**

Some girls join in kindergarten or first grade and progress through all six Girl Scout levels. Some girls join later to go camping, pursue a passion, become part of a troop or travel with other girls. The six Girl Scout program levels are:

- Girl Scout Daisy, grades K-1
- Girl Scout Brownie, grades 2-3
- Girl Scout Junior, grades 4-5
- Girl Scout Cadette, grades 6-8
- Girl Scout Senior, grades 9-10
- Girl Scout Ambassador, grades 11 – 12

All Girl Scout levels are based on the varying abilities, needs and interests girls have in different grades.

Proceeds stay in Orange County to help provide support and training for Girl Scout volunteers, girl leadership experiences, events and activities, safe facilities and financial aid to help make Girl Scouting available to more local girls.

- 82% of **high-achieving alumnae** believe that Girl Scouting influenced their success.
